Dave Bunker made a motion to not approve optional Policy BDDH-AR, *Public Comment at Board Meetings*. Lucy Beck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

New Business -

A) High School Math Credits

Departmental recommendation, proposed wording regarding curriculum for handbook Discussion -

- Algebra 1 and above credit be awarded only to grades 9-12 at NHS
- All students 3 years of math for graduation
- Students entering a four year college or university 3 years of math, Algebra 1 or above
- NHS Honors Program 4 math classes, Algebra 1 or above
- Allow college credits at high school
- Middle school Algebra 1 credit, transfer to high school
- State requirement 3 years of Algebra 1 and above

Concerns -

- Recommendation says NHS but what about students transferring in from other districts
- Proposed wording

Recommendation -

- Reasonable to transcript middle school Algebra 1 credit
- Address concerns and wording before publication

<u>Financial Report</u> - Business Manager Lindsay Malinowski presented the monthly bills and financial statements.

Recommendation -

- Support and trust administrators to do their job
- Message this shares and sends to staff is they are doing a great job and policy is followed as determined by the Superintendent
- B) Board Scholarship

Discussion -

- \$5,000 distribute total amount this year, no carryover to next year
- Applications due April 20
- Use same application form as last year
- Applications to be reviewed by Dennis Savage, Lucy Beck & Marlon Wilson
